THE TABERNACLE REHABILITATION PROJECT accomplished several large goals in 2022; including scraping, prepping and painting the entire exterior of the building, removing the old carpet and replacing it with new carpet squares and transforming old pews into new stage flooring. It was an amazing

amount of work with limited resources and an awesome amount of volunteer help. The next steps are air-flow for cooling and a new roof.

Have you ever sat in the Tabernacle on a hot June evening and felt uncomfortably warm? The wonderful 133-year-old building was originally

designed to whisk hot air up and out two giant towers but through time, natural disaster and remodeling that air-cooling function is no longer up to the task. The solution: really big ceiling fans! These fans will move massive amounts of air and create the kind of air-flow that will let you focus on what's happening on the platform rather than the sweat running down your back. The only thing you have to
